NEWS FROM ABU DIS/ PALESTINE

Child prisoners – There are currently sixteen child prisoners from Abu Dis inside Israeli jails – We welcome your support for the child prisoner campaign.

Sound bombs thrown by Israeli soldiers into Abu Dis Boys' School yard on 29th December (you will have emails that tell you more about this)

On Thursday 30th, many people were held for hours and beaten at a military checkpoint put up by Israeli soldiers in the middle of Abu Dis.

On 10th Jan, soldiers broke down the door of a nursery in Abu Dis and searched it. (no children were there – but the door has been left broken)

Violence is continuing all over the West Bank.

A woman demonstrator was killed in a Bil'in protest against the Wall on 31st Dec – She was killed by poison tear gas. Her brother was shot last April, also on a non-violent demonstration against the Wall.

On 3rd January, a young man in Toubas (Jordan Valley) was shot by Israeli soldiers. The Israelis who shot him gave the excuse that he was armed. He was carrying a coca cola bottle.

A 66-year old man was shot in his bed in Hebron last week.

Settlements are extending.

In 2011 Camden Abu Dis hopes to

- Go on working on human rights issues in Palestine with Camden teachers and schools. We are distributing our books and films and organising a visit to Palestine in April for a teacher from each of the nine Camden schools now linking to Abu Dis schools.
- Run a project for women following on from the amazing Stories from our Mothers project - this time focusing on Jerusalem.
- Raise money for a 6th visit of Palestinian children to Britain, probably to do more film work with Camden young people and this time to focus on issues of water.
- Continue with our child prisoner campaign and our monthly human rights reports and raise urgent action cases when needed.
- Work across the community in Camden - Run visits to Palestine - support the diabetic programme in the Camden Clinic in Abu Dis - find volunteers to go to Palestine -help the Dar Assadaqa Community Centre.
- Work with and help support the other groups in the Britain Palestine Twinning Network who share our aim of promoting human rights and international humanitarian law through building links with communities in Palestine...
- And much more.
